4-H Exhibitor Eligibility

- Must have passed their 8th birthday, but not have passed their 19th birthday, before January 1 of the current year.
- Must be a member of an organized Huntingdon County 4-H club that carries the specific project.
- Must be a member in good standing.

- FFA Exhibitor Eligibility
- Must be a current dues paying member carrying the specific project under the supervision of a Vocational Agriculture Instructor in a school recognized to show at the Huntingdon County Fair.
- A member may retain active membership until November 30, following the fourth National FFA Convention after graduation from high school. Active membership cannot be retained beyond the member's twenty-third birthday.

Livestock exhibitors must receive Quality Assurance training prior to showing at the fair.

Entry Forms

- No late entries.

Market Livestock Exhibition

- Market livestock must be tagged at the Fall or Spring Tag Day with the official HCJLC ear tag.
- Exhibitors must be on time to weigh, show, and sell.
- Market animals must be present at their species weigh-in time. Late arrivals due to extraordinary circumstances will be weighed at the discretion of the livestock superintendents.
- Exhibitors may only weigh, show, and sell a maximum of 4 tagged market animals, including meat pens.
- No reweighs. No replacements.
- Animals not making weight must be removed from the fairgrounds by midnight of weigh-in day.
- Market animals must be shown in the ring and be sold through the Junior Livestock Sale on Friday.

Health and General Rules

Adhere to Animal Health Regulations, Livestock and Dairy General Rules, and the Code of Show Ring Ethics.

Housekeeping

- Exhibitors shall clean or get stall area ready to be cleaned mechanically by 2 p.m. Saturday, the last day of the fair. If the area is not cleaned satisfactorily, \$50 per head will be deducted from the sale check or billed for those exhibiting breeding projects only.
- The fair is not responsible for personal items or equipment left behind.

Substitute Showman Criteria

- Conflict between the exhibitor's livestock show and another fair premium contest on the fairgrounds. Not covered: Non-premium contests or extracurricular activities.
- Sickness or physical injury after arriving at the show preventing the owner from showing his/her own animal. Previous injury or illness prohibiting an exhibitor from showing requires a doctor's excuse.
- Exhibitor has two or more animals in the same class or of different breeds showing at the same time.

Anyone receiving substitute showman permission attending the show while physically capable of showing will be disqualified. Substitute Showman must:

- Be approved by the species or livestock superintendent.
- Notify the ring man that he/she is not the owner.
- Be another 4-H or FFA member of the same age or younger.

Medication Withdrawal

- Market exhibitors may not exhibit any animal that will still be within the medication withdrawal period on sale day. If upon slaughter a recent treatment with drugs or biologics is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the exhibitor will bear the loss of the carcass.
- Fair personnel reserve the right to blood test animals for illegal use of drugs or antibiotics.
- Medication given fair week must have veterinarian approval and Livestock Superintendents must be notified.
- Animals receiving medication with a withdrawal period beyond sale day must be removed from the fair immediately.

Section 3.1 - 4-H and FFA Breeding Beef Cattle

Sunday, 8 a.m., Large Arena.

- 1. 4-H and FFA exhibitors must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging in the show ring.
- 2. Registration papers must be presented at check in between 10 a.m.-12 p.m. on Saturday, August 3, 2024 at the Longhorn Barn.
- 3. All beef cattle must be naturally polled or dehorned.
- 4. All cattle must be registered with their nationally recognized breed association in the 4-H or FFA member's name by May 1 of the current year.
- 5. All cattle in Bred and Owned classes must be bred and owned by the exhibitor.
- 6. Any breeds with fewer than 4 entries will be shown together under the category "All Other Breeds."
- 7. Cow/calf pairs with 2 different breed registrations will be shown in the cow's breed class. The heifer calf will be shown in its breed class. Junior bull calves are shown together in one "All-breed" class.
- 8. A Junior Bull Calf must be part of a cow/calf pair being exhibited in the 4-H and FFA Breeding Beef Show.
- 9. The Junior Bull Calf class will consist of all eligible calves from all breed divisions.
- 10. Breeding beef are released at 8 p.m. Friday, and must be on exhibit in their assigned stalls until then.

Section 3.3 - 4-H and FFA Market Steers, Type

Tuesday, 8 a.m., Large Arena, following Beef Showmanship.

- 1. Exhibitors may only show and sell one steer at the fair.
- Steers can be shown in both Type and Carcass shows. To show in both Type and Carcass classes, exhibitors must enter both classes online or on the Livestock Entry and Stall Space Reservation by July 1. Sale order for steers in both type and carcass steer classes will be determined by the type class placing with the exception of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Carcass Steers.
- 3. All market steers must be of beef breed type, either purebred or a composite of beef breeds.
- 4. All market steers must be naturally polled or dehorned.
- 5. Market steers must be free of testicular development to show at the fair. All steers must be castrated by Fall Tag Day.
- 6. Steers must weigh at least 1,000 lbs. to be eligible to show and sell at the fair.
- 7. Type steers must be weighed at the large scale on Saturday, August 3, 2024 at 1 pm.
- 8. Weight classes for the Type steers will be set after weigh-in.
- 9. Type steers will compete with the Carcass steers in Showmanship classes and the Obstacle Course.
- 10. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding, watering, and caring for their steers until load out after the sale on Friday.
- 11. Rope halters must be left on steers for load out after the sale.

Section 3.4 - 4-H and FFA Market Steers, Carcass

Saturday, approximatly 1-4 p.m., Large Arena, following Weigh-in.

- 1. Exhibitors may only show and sell one steer at the fair.
- Steers can be shown in both Type and Carcass shows. To show in both Type and Carcass classes, exhibitors must enter both classes online or on the Livestock Entry and Stall Space Reservation by July 1. Sale order for steers in both type and carcass steer classes will be determined by the type class placing with the exception of the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Carcass Steers.
- 3. All market steers must be of beef breed type, either purebred or a composite of beef breeds.
- 4. All market steers must be naturally polled or dehorned.
- 5. Market steers must be free of testicular development to show at the fair. All steers must be castrated by Fall Tag Day.
- 6. Steers must weigh at least 1,000 lbs. to be eligible to show and sell at the fair.
- 7. Carcass steers must be weighed at the large scale on Saturday, August 3, 2024 at 1 pm.
- 8. Carcass steers will report directly to the ultrasound area after they are weighed. Data from the ultrasound will be processed, the ultimate carcass value determined and the results announced on Wednesday following selection of the Grand Champion Type steer.
- 9. Carcass steers will compete with the Type steers in Showmanship classes and the Obstacle Course.
- 10. All Carcass steers are in one class.
- 11. The top 5 carcass steers will be presented and placed in the show ring. Sixth through tenth placed will be announced.
- 12. First place carcass steer will be Grand Champion. Second place carcass steer will be Reserve Grand Champion.
- 13. The carcass steers will sell immediately following the type steers.
- 14. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding, watering, and caring for their steers until load out after the sale on Friday.
- 15. Rope halters must be left on steers for load out after the sale.
- 16. A spreadsheet of all carcass steer data will be made available for both the show results and the sale.

- 3. An exhibitor may enter once for each species. Exhibitor must show his/her own animal.
- 4. A score will be given for several obstacles maneuvered. Time will be kept to break ties.

Market Animal Exhibitor-Required Documents

Drug Free Affidavit

It is the responsibility of all market exhibitors not to exhibit any animal that will still be within the medication withdrawal period on sale day. Any medication that must be administered during fair week can only be done by meeting all 3 of the following criteria:

1. Medication must be administered under a veterinarian's supervision.

2. All vet expenses will be assumed by the exhibitor.

3. The Junior Livestock Committee officers must be notified prior to medication being administered. Any animal receiving medication with a withdrawal period then must be removed from the fair as soon as possible.

I have read and understand the regulation listed above and hereby agree to abide by the regulations. I declare that the market animal(s) I have entered in the Huntingdon County Fair have not received any drugs or treatment with biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter.
