- 2. Entries must be entered on Saturday, August 3, from 11-5 p.m. in Neary Hall and removed Saturday, August 10, from 9-noon.
- 3. Choose uniform specimens. Select for quality not for size.
- 4. Fruit and nuts must be grown by the exhibitor in the past year. Edible nuts will be marked that they were exhibited this year.
- 6. Have the exhibits properly tagged for a class listed below. Single specimens may not be considered or shown in variety class.
- 7. The judge reserves the right to award the placing that the exhibit merits regardless of the number of entries.
